

# Principal's Message,

**Hello once again to all the Lurnea High School community!** It's hard to comprehend how fast the year has flown! I hope this letter finds everyone well and looking forward to the festive season and holiday break.

## **Term 3 and 4 news and activities**

- **External Validation** – as noted in an earlier newsletter, the school completed the External Validation process with flying colours on 16 August! While this entire process was something very new to all public schools, and particularly so for us because we were being validated in the first week of the new state-wide system, the experience proved worthwhile and rewarding. The evidence we gathered to support our own self-assessment against the School Excellence Framework (SEF) in the three areas of **Learning, Teaching** and **Leading** was rich and detailed. The validation team supported the schools' analysis and the conclusions we had drawn about the level the school was operating at in relation to the 14 elements of the SEF. We confidently identified that we are operating at the Sustaining and Growing level in most of the elements. We know we have further work to do in relation to the elements of Learning Culture, Effective Classroom Practice and Student Performance Measures. We have plans in place to address these elements in our ongoing efforts for continual improvement.
- **MADD Night** – many parents, friends and students enjoyed the third annual MADD Night event last term where students showcased their talents in the areas of Music, Art and Dance, including several year 7 boys performing their Slam Poems! The event was the result of the collaborative efforts of a number of staff, under the leadership of Ms Messimeris. Every year student talent in the arts grows and matures. It is a credit to the hard work of staff and the many students who get involved that this wonderful program is a highlight of our annual program!
- **HSC Graduation and Formal** – another event that is a delightful highlight on our yearly calendar is the Year 12 Graduation assembly and formal celebration at Camden Lakeside. The work of Year Adviser Ms Tolhurst and other staff, notably Ms Melissa Gunn, made this occasion so memorable. The atmosphere at the assembly was fantastic! The hall was packed with friends and families and the celebrations afterwards with photos, food and fun continued for some time. Students gathered later for the Formal in all their beauty and style! The dresses, cars and handsome attire of the boys were very memorable. Congratulations to all year 12 students – we wish you well in your future lives now the HSC exams have finally concluded.
- **Year 5 PBL days** – over the last two years we have endeavoured to introduce year 5 students from our feeder primary schools (Lurnea, Casula, Prestons and Liverpool West) to a taste of project-based learning at high school. This work has been led by Deputy Principal Rene Cahill and a team of teachers. The theme for the day focuses on the Minions where year 5 students take charge of their learning for the day and learn something about the different subjects that make up high school learning.



- **Retirements** – Mr Peter Zegiel (Head Teacher Maths) and Mrs Margaret Robb (Learning and Support teacher) have announced their retirements from the NSW Department of Education. This is a significant milestone for any teacher and while both Peter and Margaret are looking forward to life after school, their presence, contributions and experience will be missed by staff and students.
- Peter has worked in education for 38 years, teaching mainly in the south western Sydney region and Margaret has worked in many areas of education and then in public schools for 21 years.
- Farewell celebrations are planned for both Peter and Margaret. On behalf of every student and all staff, I thank them both for their work at Lurnea High School and wish them long, happy and fulfilling lives beyond the school gates enjoying good health, lots of fun and many new activities!

- **Other staff farewells:** Talented Visual Arts teacher, Ms Silvana Papalia has gained a service transfer to Westfields Sports HS. She will take up her new position from the first day back next year. Silvana has taught at LHS for 10 years and has made a significant contribution to the arts programs both in terms of general teaching and learning as well as in relation to whole school and community arts development. She too will be missed by colleagues and students alike. I wish her continuing success at her new school, and know with confidence that she will be a huge asset to the creative arts experiences of students at Westfields.
- Science teacher and co-leader of the Science faculty, Mr Nick Toovey has gained a promotion to Head Teacher Maths/Science at Airds HS. Nick leaves Lurnea at the end of week 5 to take up his new leadership position. Nick has been at Lurnea for 6 years and has contributed in important ways to the profile of Science within the school as well as to the leadership and management of the Science faculty with Head Teacher Sarah Crawford. Nick is excited about his new substantive position and I too wish him continuing success at Airds and know that he will bring a passionate, innovative leadership style to both the Science faculty and to the students.

## **2017 Planning**

- **New staff and staff in new positions for 2017:** next year the school will welcome Ms Joumana Fares as Head Teacher Maths. Joumana comes from Granville South Performing Arts HS and will lead and manage the Maths faculty for terms 1 and 2. She brings a wealth of experience and is keen to work with staff to continue the fabulous developments in Maths learning that have been started here in recent times.
- In addition, Mr Edward Kumar will move into a newly created (and school funded) executive position as Head Teacher VET. Edward has been the VET Coordinator at LHS for several years and will use his executive role to lead and manage the 8 staff who teach a VET course as well as help the school expand this highly valuable program into Stage 5 in 2018.
- Ms Rachel Berry will step up to act in the role of Head Teacher Social Science. Rachel is an experienced Social Science teacher who will lead and manage the faculty in all teaching and learning programs as well as through the implementation of the new National Curriculum in Geography.
- In other roles, Ms Ajla Bajic and Ms Melissa Gunn will co-lead the new student leadership portfolio and Ms Nilfar Mishra will lead and manage the weekly Sport and Recreation program

- **Speech Pathology program for year 7** – to better cater for the literacy learning needs of students in year 7, the school has invested in the services of a Speech Pathology program for 2017. This strategy aligns with one of the findings of the External Validation process as well as the Premier's Literacy and Numeracy priorities to improve student outcomes and achievements in these important skills. Together with our strong Learning and Support team of teachers and School Learning Support Officers (SLSOs), the school is aiming to provide targeted and explicit support for individuals and groups of students, team teaching and professional learning for staff to lift student performance in NAPLAN.
- **Renewal Plans:** work has begun this term on evaluating both the weekly Sport and Recreation program and the important matter of Student Leadership. Surveys have been conducted about sport and recreation and a number of issues (both positive and negative) have emerged that require attention in order to improve and strengthen the program. I have started the process of analysing the strengths and weaknesses of the current student leadership strategy and have sent a small team of staff and students to look at a highly successful and innovative model at nearby Ashcroft HS. They will gather information and ideas to bring back to a Student Leadership Conference day planned for 28 November. I will publish updates about these two programs in early 2017.
- **Expanding learning spaces:** as mentioned in earlier newsletters, the school has been negotiating with Assets Management to redevelop some of the very small classrooms in the Support Unit into a single open plan learning space. In addition, the newly developed VET Shop is almost ready for operation! We have also invested in plans to develop a new Learning and Support learning space to cater for the growing learning needs of our students. WE anticipate that these spaces will be ready to move into by the middle of term 1, 2017.

Thank you to all the community for your support of the school and the hardworking staff! It is only through our shared actions that we can make positive differences to the educational outcomes of our students.

I wish everyone a safe, happy, positive holiday and festive season. See you all in 2017 for another productive educational year at Lurnea High School!

Spring has sprung and the warm weather is upon us. This means a bucket full of work for our industrious gardeners.

We have been busy pulling out the winter crops and getting the beds ready for our summer plantings. All the snow and green peas have been pulled out and for some reason we didn't manage to save any of the seeds. Happy gardening everybody.




## Fairfax Design an Ad Competition
